MIRABILE is the portal providing access to the extensive databases and the journals produced by the Società Internazionale per lo Studio del Medioevo Latino (www.sismelfirenze.it), the Fondazione Ezio Franceschini (www.fefonlus.it) and, since the beginning of 2012, significant databases from other organizations and research institutes. In addition to Medieval Latin culture (Medieval Latin database), MIRABILE includes medieval vernacular culture (Romance database) and a specific section devoted to hagiographic texts and manuscripts (Hagiographic database). Moreover, since 2014, in addition to the Journals, is available a new section devoted to the miscellany volumes published by Edizioni del Galluzzo. All the contents are available in an integrated format such that online access is even more profitable, opening possibilities for multidisciplinary research.

MADOC. Manuscripta Doctrinalia (sec. XIII-XV)

The project aims at identifying the main centers of elaboration of both philosophical and juridical culture through the 13th and 14th centuries: individual authors and works, circulation and networks of reception, manuscripts. The gradual acquisition and description of the manuscripts is expected to create the conditions for an Atlas of Medieval Philosophy.

MAGI. Hagiographic manuscripts from the Biblioteca Medicea Laurenziana

MAGI is a repertory of 218 manuscripts concerning, wholly or in part, hagiographic content and belonging to the Biblioteca Medicea Laurenziana of Florence. More than 50 legendaries and lectionaries (traditional and abbreviated), approximately 20 homiliaries, miscellanies containing single *vitae*, hagiographic dossier on a saint or a religious Order, collections of the *Vitae Patrum*, collections by individual authors, such as the *Dialogi* of Gregory the Great.

Interactive Journal Articles. In every journal article in Mirabile, it's now possible to click on its Author and to have the direct access, in case of active subscription to the "All repertories" package, to all the occurrences concerning to the Scholar in the entire database. Similarly there is a link to the keywords related to the article (subjects, medieval authors and texts, manuscripts) that allows to access to all the database resources. All this provides a comprehensive picture of information and an useful interpretation key for the article.




All the miscellany volumes essays and the Journal articles are searchable at the full-text level starting from a bibliographical search.

LEXICONS

For many years the Lexicographical Section has promoted research on Medieval Latin Lexicons through the publication of critical editions and commentaries. In this area of scholarship, SISMEL has come to recognize the importance and possibilities inherent in the creation of the *Lessici mediolatini, LeMeL* database, which allows consultation and research on a corpus of texts using the resources offered by new technologies. The lexicons now available in Mirabile, in PDF format, permitting basic word searching, represent the first step in a larger project.

ABC. Ancient Camaldolese Library

The project catalogues the Camaldolese manuscripts present in Florentine libraries. To date approximately 260 manuscripts held in the Biblioteca Medicea Laurenziana and the Biblioteca Nazionale Centrale have been catalogued, with more work yet to be completed. Particular attention has been given to the 'origin' of the manuscripts, as well as their historical fortunes and references in inventories with the aim of creating an atlas of Camaldolese culture on conclusion of the project. The descriptions are being compiled in ABC and, at the outset, Mirabile will offer a total of 193 catalogue entries, in some cases, linked to illustrations and annotations.

ROME. Collection of Medieval Sermons

The project aims to organise a catalogue of medieval homilaries: these are homogeneous collections of sermons and texts on the art of preaching which, for the most part, circulated anonymously in manuscript form. The main characteristics of these homily

collections are their anthologised form, which is particularly varied, and their transmission, which remains largely still to be studied. The cataloguing of the homilaries involves the detailed description of individual homilary texts and the collection of which they are a part. The repertory at the moment comprises 40 collections for a total of almost 3,500 sermons by approximately 80 authors.

TETRA. Mediaeval Latin Texts and their Transmission

Active since 2000, the project aims to provide a census of the transmission of Medieval Latin works similar to that for ancient Latin authors in the now classic Texts and Transmission, edited by L. D. Reynolds. Therefore, for each individual work: the manuscripts in which it was preserved; the first printed editions, other editions, citations and reuse; attestations of its circulation in different period and places.

TRAMP. Manuscript Tradition of the Church Fathers

The objective of the project is to build a database of Latin Patristic manuscripts, with entries on authors and texts (anonymous and pseudo-attributions) dating within the 5th century and manuscripts dating within the 15th century. In the knowledge of the years of work necessary for full synthesis of the data, we have chosen to go ahead with cataloguing, not by author but by collection.

LIO. Repertory of Italian Lyric Poetry from Origins to Dante

Analytical records of approximately 180 authors and 4,000 liric compositions, complete with philological bibliography and details of the manuscript tradition

MAFRA. French Manuscripts in Italy

The database catalogues 131 manuscripts (99 with French texts and 32 with Provencal texts) and includes chronology and subject indices

TECOLM. Texts and Codices of Medieval Lombardy

TeCoLM is a digital archive containing the descriptions of all the manuscripts of the vernacular literacy from Lombard region, from 13th to 15th century. It collects the membra disiecta of the vernacular works of authors from Lombard region in a single database, furnishing clear information about codicological, palaeographical and linguistic features.

TRALIRO. Hypertext catalogue of the Romance Lyric Tradition from Its Origins

TraLiRO is a catalogue devoted to the manuscript tradition of medieval lyric texts from the Romance language areas. The aim of the research tool is to sketch a concise, detailed picture of the manuscript tradition of the various authors belonging to the first phase of lyric production in each of the areas under consideration (Italian, French, Provencal, Castilian, Galician-Portuguese).
